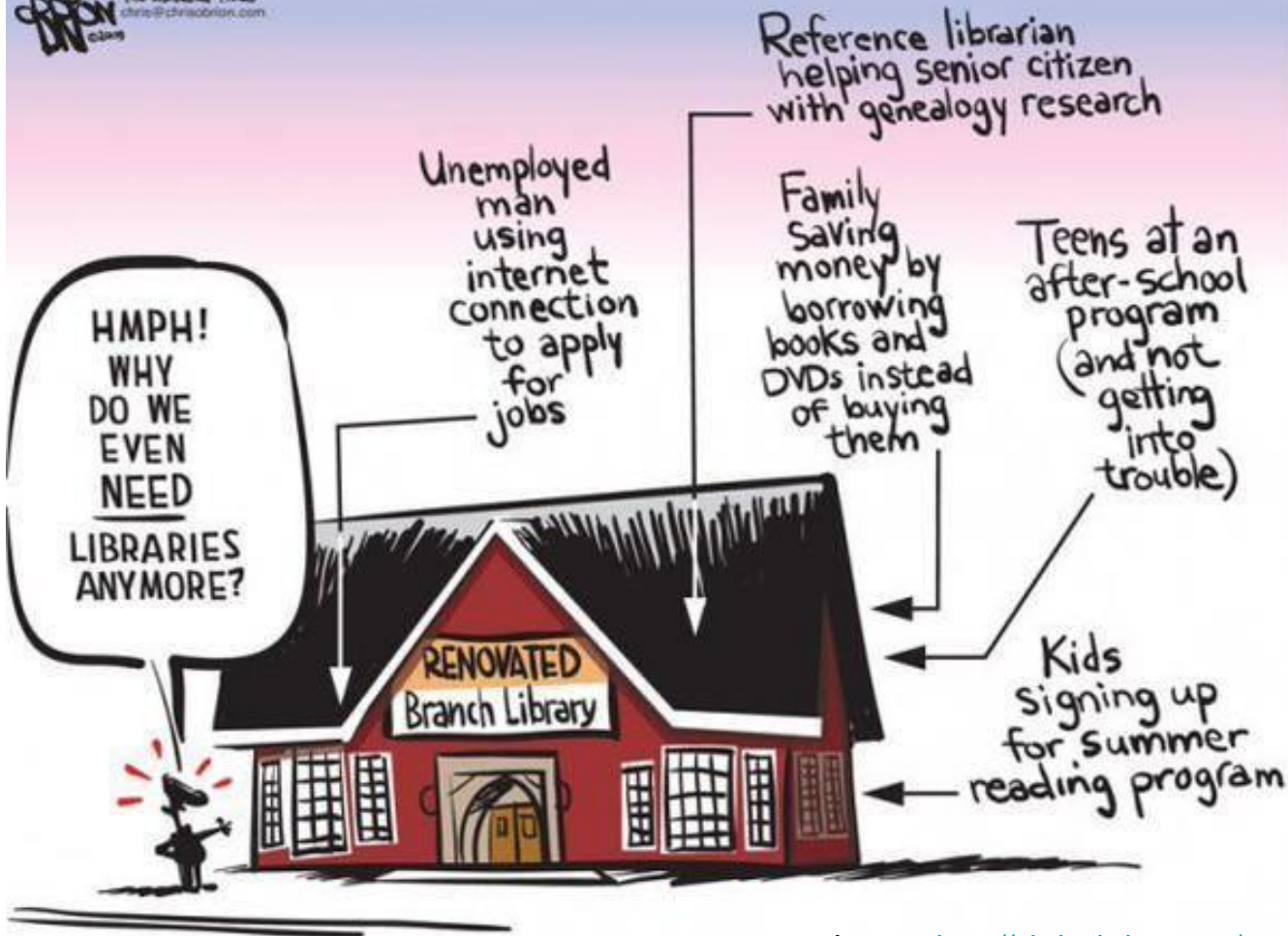

So why bother?

A grant might enable you to:

- Make a change in your community
- Do something you wouldn't or couldn't usually do
- Address an unmet need in your community
- Provide a vital service
- Raise your profile
- Be more creative in your service
- Buy new equipment or resources
- Extend yourself & learn new skills



SLQ funding



VISION 2017 grants are designed to support Queensland public libraries to become creative community spaces; physical and virtual connectors; technology trendsetters; and incubators of ideas, learning and innovation.

- SLQ's Online Public Access in Libraries (OPAL) Program provides a \$200,000 annual grant program to Local Government
- OPAL aims to enhance community access to information online, encourage online engagement or develop the digital literacy skills of library staff or the community.



ideas@108 – Burdekin

- \$36,500 VISION 2017 grant and \$8,000 Qld Govt. Office of Liquor and Gaming Regulation Community Benefit fund
- To establish a multifunctional flexible space for growing ideas with a particular focus on small business, start-ups and youth

Thursday Island Creative Digital Space

- \$73,000 of OPAL funding from SLQ in 2014
- Thursday Island library refurbishment
- Torres Shire Council sought to deliver a modern library service within a small footprint in a building attached to and owned by the local supermarket

Tech Savvy Seniors

- New partnership between Qld Government and Telstra
- \$400,000 funding to SLQ
- Grants then provided to eligible public libraries of up to \$25,000 to deliver free training to seniors in their community
- To develop skills and confidence in using technology.

Digital Hub - Toowoomba

- Dept of Communications
\$452,600 over 2 years
- Free training (group and individual) to develop digital skills to participate safely and securely, with trust and confidence, in the digital economy
- Topics based on community demand and interest

Community Heritage Grant Hinchinbrook

- \$4,000 grant funded by the Australian Government through the National Library of Australia
- To assist in the identification and preservation of community-owned and nationally significant heritage collections
- Staff attended a three day intensive preservation and collection management workshop to gain expertise

Little Free Libraries

- Rotary District 9570 grant of \$1,000
- Local partners in Bundaberg:
Regional Libraries
East Rotary
Woodworkers Guild
- To build, stock and install four LFLs by March 2016 to promote literacy, increase access to reading and encourage community connectivity

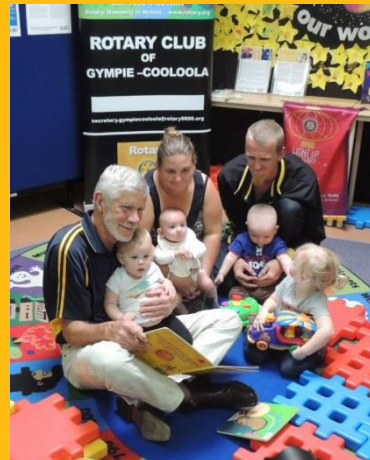

Dolly Parton Imagination Library

- Dolly Parton grant of \$5,000 over 2 years, with a 5 year commitment
- Community partnership with:
 - Rotary Club of Gympie-Cooloola
 - United Way Australia
 - Gympie Regional Library
 - Members of the LAGG
- Literacy, learning, enjoyment of reading through stories, play; and promoting reading at home to babies and pre-schoolers

Culture Love

- Primarily funded by Arts Qld approx \$268,000
- Partnership between SLQ and Indigenous Knowledge Centres plus local assistance (Councils, Queensland Health)
- Digital literacy through the arts

- 2010 launched with seed funding from Arts Qld
- 2011-12 \$85,920 from Copyright Agency Ltd Cultural Fund
- 2013-14 \$78,000 for On-screen Indigenous Editing from Australia Council for the Arts
- 2014-15 \$77,500 for Editing Interns

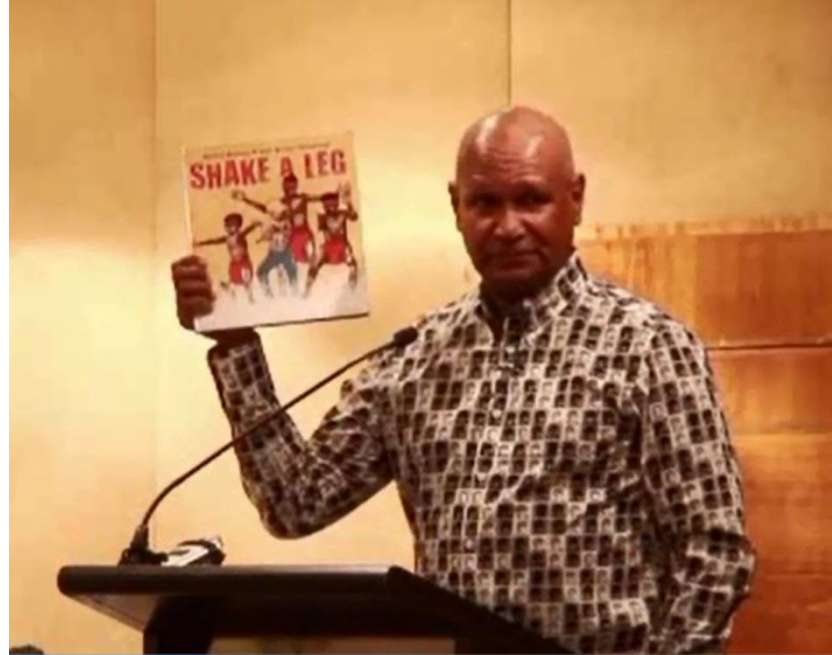

Gold Coast partnerships that don't cost

- Filmmaking – working with local film makers for 6 week course in filmmaking for teenagers, on mobile devices, used media and sound lab culminating in a film festival in an auditorium
- Regional Arts Development Fund recipients – augmented reality museum where models that are 3D printed are embedded with content via 8 different art forms



Strategies to improve success 1

Make sure you address:

- Who (target audience and why)
- What (is the project and why)
- Why (what is the need)
- Where (location and why)
- When (dates and why)
- How (what is the process)



Strategies to improve success 2

It's all about the grantee –how will your project address:

- Their objectives
- Their goals
- Their anticipated outcomes
- Their benefits

THINK and articulate – how and why your project is perfect for them



It's not all about you...

- Who can you partner with?
- How can they help you and vice versa?
- Be clear about who will benefit and how?
- Get someone else to read it
- Be clear about your purpose – this project will.....



Other important things...

- Elements of your Library / Council Strategic Plan
- Your Vision / Mission statement
- Australian Bureau of Statistics region profiles / data
- Letters of support
- The Next Horizon: VISION 2017 for Queensland public libraries

Most importantly – look at their goals / objectives ...are you aligned with them?
Are you helping them deliver on them?

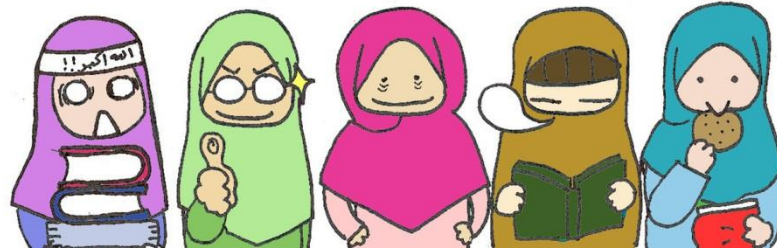
